



Objective and description:

PAST to FUTURE is an innovative and interdisciplinary program, that brings a complex perspective and a diverse specialization in the field of heritage and sustainable development of rural communities. The course will use as pilot case a village from Bukovina area, with a rich historic, industrial and cultural heritage, with a diverse and multi-ethnic population, with natural resources and a high potential for the development of sustainable tourism. The students will have the chance to acquire new skills in the field of heritage protection and will learn how to establish a plan for rural regeneration of the communities, enhancing the local resources: nature, vernacular architecture, industrial heritage sites, immaterial heritage.

The main objective is to allow students to familiarize themselves with field work methods, documentation techniques, valorization of tangible and intangible cultural heritage by means of classic and new technologies, i.e. conducting interviews, filming, data processing, 3D scans.

After the participation to the program the students will have new competences in the field of heritage research and interpretation, and in the field of sustainable development of communities, through participatory approach.

The first day of the program will be organized in Suceava, at the University "Stefan cel Mare". The BIP objectives will be presented, and the students will attend to lectures related to importance of heritage in the sustainable development of rural communities. Later it will be visited the open-air Bucovina Village Museum and the Suceava Citadel. In the second day, the students will attend to a familiarization round trip in Suceava County (Bukovina destination), to several UNESCO monuments (painted churches of Moldavia <https://whc.unesco.org/en/list/598/>) and to several workshops and heritage interpretation centres. The last four days will be organized in partnership with Cacica Municipality. The students will be accommodated for the rest of the program in Cacica, our pilot-community. Under the supervision of lecturers and the professor from partner universities, in common agreement with the local partner organizations, students will attend the following workshops:

**Workshop 1. Exploring tourism resources in developing a future sustainable community.
Local development through participatory approach.**

Workshop 2. Heritage research and interpretation. Documentation and promotion of heritage.**Workshop 3. Discovering and analysing traditional materials and construction techniques and transfer to a future and sustainable architecture.**

Field trips will alternate with individual and team work sessions, lectures, meetings with local stakeholders. At the end, the students will share their findings and their proposals and future actions to the group of learners and to the guests from the community.

Program highlights:**Methods and outcomes:**

The program will allow an immersion in the PAST, discovering the heritage through history, through hands-on experimentation of traditional handicrafts and materials, but will open new perspective for the FUTURE, through the solutions and proposals that will be developed by the students, to better understand, safeguard and promote cultural heritage.

The course combines experiential learning and immersion learning, having a high practical approach. As kick-off activity, a familiarization trip will be organized, to several UNESCO monuments (painted churches of Moldavia <https://whc.unesco.org/en/list/598/>) and to several workshops and Heritage Interpretation Centres. The main methods that will be activated are participatory observation, study cases, workshops and hand-on activities, problematization and analytic thinking, documentation of heritage (digital tools, drone and digital photography, social media and internet sites, 3D scanning). There will be used focus groups organized with the representatives of the local communities, group presentations and discussions, inter-disciplinary exchange among working groups.

The results will be integrated in a joint plan for the sustainable development of the community and will help the development of a bottom-up approach for understanding heritage, "reselling" the heritage to the local community and changing their perception and perspective.

TOPICS and workshops PAST to FUTURE

1. **Workshop 1. Exploring tourism resources in developing a future sustainable community. Local development through participatory approach (Comm TOUR– Community and tourism).**
The main topic of the lectures will cover the development of communities in participatory approach. The students will develop, with the support of WS Coordinator, a resource Map of the community. There will be demonstration for 3D Scanning of tourism attractions
2. **Workshop 2. Heritage research and interpretation. Documentation and promotion of heritage (HERITAGE Lab).** The first objective of the course is to document and understand the forms, uses and meanings of the cultural heritage of the Bukovina region and to grasp its articulations with tourism and other forms of local development. The second objective is to lead students to take a critical look at the issues of social and territorial development through heritage in the light of their experiences, visits and discussions with local actors. At the end, students will propose possible solutions and intervention tools for the enhancement of the heritage that they will present to the local community and the other participants in the Summer School.
3. **Workshop 3. Discovering and analysing traditional materials and construction techniques and transfer to a future and sustainable architecture (PAST).**
There will be organised presentations and hand-on activities, related to archaic and traditional construction materials and technics, coordinated by local hand workers. In centre will be the clay and wood, and the working spot will be PAST Heritage centre, the small experiential house in Cacica.

Community in Action

The members of the community will be present during the Summer School, giving support to the students and contributing to the reparation of the informational panels, introductory activities and presentation of the community.
